UNPAID BOOKINGS

Fullers reserves the right to resell any unpaid bookings 30 minutes prior to departure of the service.

CHECK IN TIME

Check in time is 1 hour prior to departure.

FREIGHT

All freight must be booked through our freight department prior to travel. Call 09 367 9104.

UNDER 14S

Passengers under the age of 14 years or passengers who are regarded as too young or not competent to or fit to travel must be accompanied by a responsible person at least 14 years or older

SEA SICKNESS

If passengers are prone to sea sickness or have a medical condition that may be aggravated by adverse weather and sea states, Fullers advises that you please make this known to the staff who will advise you of the likely sea conditions on that day. You may be advised not to travel.

WEATHER & CANCELLATIONS

Passengers are advised that rough seas and adverse weather conditions can affect travel to Great Barrier Island. This may require us to cancel services in the interests of passenger comfort and safety, and may result in passengers needing to make alternative arrangements at their own expense. However, a refund will be given on the unused ticket, should there be one. All requests must be made to Fullers within 28 days of original date of travel.

LUGGAGE

Two pieces of suitcase size or easy to lift luggage (maximum weight 20kgs) per paying passenger are permitted free of charge; luggage tags for these will be issued when you collect your ticket. Excess luggage must be paid for at the time of booking. Please remember which cage number your luggage goes into for easy identification at your destination. Luggage and carry on bags are the responsibility of passengers concerned. Fullers liability for luggage is limited to liability pursuant to the Carriage of Goods Act 1979.

DOGS, BIKES, SURFBOARDS

Dogs must be on a lead to travel on the ferry. Dogs are not allowed on any lands administered by DOC. All surfboards, bikes and dogs must be pre-booked and pre-paid. Bookings are essential as there is limited space available for these items and, unless booked on when booking your own ticket, can be refused on the day.

DANGEROUS GOODS

No petrol or gas cylinders may be carried in personal luggage. Items with a fuel tank must be declared and the tank empty. Small LPG bottles, paint, batteries and other dangerous substances must be declared and stowed safely. If in doubt declare the item to the master of the vessel.

TIMETABLE

Fullers operates seasonal services to Great Barrier Island during the summer months. Ferries depart from Downtown Auckland and arrive into either Tryphena or Port FitzRoy.

ABOUT GREAT BARRIER ISLAND

Situated in the Hauraki Gulf about 2½ hours from Auckland by Fullers ferry, Great Barrier Island is one of New Zealand's best kept secrets. Sparsely populated with large areas of rugged, un-spoilt natural beauty, it is a haven where you can really get away from it all.

Hiking, mountain biking, diving, surfing and fishing are all popular adventure activities on the island. Beautiful walking tracks through native forests lead to secluded natural hot springs and pristine white sandy beaches. The more enthusiastic trampers can head for the beckoning summit of Hirakimata (Mount Hobson) rising 627 metres above the sea, with its spectacular 360 degree views.

HISTORY

Great Barrier Island has a colourful history, dating back nearly 700 years. The island was initially inhabited by native Maori who called it Motu Aotea (island [of the] white cloud), with the first European settlers arriving in the mid-1800s. Early industries on the island were silver and gold mining and logging of native kauri trees.

However, these industries eventually moved to the mainland and due to its remote location, the island has remained relatively untouched since then.

Today the island is home to a permanent population of approximately 850 people with tourism and fishing being its main industries. Great Barrier is a popular spot for recreational fishermen, and a much loved summer holiday destination.



Did you know... The Barrier's lush Kauri forests were heavily logged from the mid 19th until the mid 20th century. The logs were dragged to nearby stream beds where wooden dam structures were constructed with a 'trapdoor' near the bottom. Once the dam filled (which could take up to a year) the trapdoor was opened, sweeping all the logs floating behind the dam out to sea, a distance of up to 25 km away!

WALKING TRACKS

From simple tracks that meander through lush native forests, to rugged hiking trails that put your skills to the test, Great Barrier has something to suit everyone. MOUNTAIN BIKING

The island's rugged terrain makes for some very adventurous biking! The Department of Conservation (DOC) has designed a shared walking/mountain biking track between Port FitzRoy and the Whangaparapara Rd. Mountain bikes are not permitted on any other DOC trails.



SURFING & SWIMMING BEACHES

Great Barrier's beaches are popular with surfers for their awesome swells. On the east coast, Kaitoke, Medlands, Whangapoua and Awana Bay are well known surf beaches on Great Barrier. The west coast offers more sheltered spots for safer swimming.



KAYAKING

The sheltered west coast of Great Barrier Island offers the best Kayaking. Inlet bays around Port Fitzroy, Tryphena and Whangaparapara are the suggested locations for paddling. Bring your own kayak, or hire one locally on the island.



DIVING

The waters surrounding Great Barrier Island are bursting with unique marine life and magnificent underwater beauty. Diving is a must do activity on the island; be it in shallow or deep sea conditions. Diving gear can be hired locally on the island.



FISHING

Famed for its delicious local seafood, Great Barrier is the perfect place to cast your fishing line. Both coasts of the island offer good fishing, with the east coast beaches offering the best surfcasting.
